Quorum: Requirements were NOT met. (Quorum is 23/66)

President (Karen Lee) Comments:

Treasurer's Report:

May 2026 and June 2026 financial reports were distributed. As of May 31, 2026, the Operating Account balance was \$4,205.90 and Capital Reserve account was \$5,573.87. During the month of May 2026, income was \$443.71 and expenditures were \$250.74. Budget utilization: 52% Income and 23% Expenses.

Old Business:

1. Longarm Committee: Good News! The Sun City Summerlin HOA FY-2026-2027 Budget was ratified as presented, which included the new Long Arm. Melissa Spina, Director of Community Services, has already contacted me for an updated cost estimate. She will need to present to two (2) committees this month so funds can be made available in July.

New Business:

1. General meetings for July and August will be held in the Pinnacle Quilt Room. The July meeting will be an Open House format.
2. Linda Pendleton announced an Out-n-About event for Wednesday, July 15, 2026, at 9:00am for a private tour of the Amazon Distribution Center with a no-host lunch to follow. We need a minimum of 10 people with a maximum of 25. You must wear closed toe shoes, no sandals. The sign-up sheet is
